PRIVACY POLICY

VoterClick data is owned by the political party and is used only for Party purposes.

Data is NOT used for any commercial purpose.

The names of delegates and party officers is public per state code 20A-8-401, shown below.

Contact information of delegates is shared with candidates.

The Party obtains voter registration information from state and county agencies as permitted by law. This is used for political purposes, including communication between candidates and delegates, Party leadership communication, and Party members communicating with each other. The names of delegates and party officers is public information, and is published by the party as provided in 20A-8-401 2 (v)

Birth date information is used only to verify the user as a registered voter against the state registration rolls and is not published to candidates or general VoterClick users.

Your year of birth is available to political parties, candidates for public office, and their contractors, employees, and volunteers, in accordance with the requirements of law. Birth year information is used only to identify voters (especially to distinguish between two voters of the same name and address) and is available to Party leaders.

Voter registration records contain some information that is available to the public, such as your name and address, some information that is available only to government entities, and some information that is available only to certain third parties in accordance with the requirements of law.
